Palestinian MCM Assistant Director, Anwar Alhjooj and Samer shared their perspectives on the Middle East ... social work student intern, Delphine Brisson (who doesn't appear in the pictures), had spent time in India and reflected with Annie on her work with the Dalit population ... hailing from Afghanistan and a medical doctor by training, new MCM staffer Muzhgan Haydary spoke of some of the challenges she has encountered on her journey of migration, and how that influences the research project she is doing at MCM on 'access to justice for vulnerable migrants' ... her Spanish colleague, Marta Pereira, explained how she brings her immigration experience and work with refugees to bear on that same project.

Each story had all of us captivated and wanting to hear more, as we enjoyed a delicious lunch provided by our *Women Weaving their Dreams/Vers un souffle nouveau* Catering Collective.

REMINDER - Remit 1: Establishing an autonomous national indigenous organization

The online Remit information sessions on October 4 (in English) with Rev. Éric Hébert-Daly and Rev. REMINDER - The governing board of each pastoral charge has a right and responsibility to vote on this remit, and all votes must be submitted by **March 31, 2024**. If a pastoral charge does not submit a vote, the default will be to count the missing vote as a vote against the remit.

REMINDER - CEBA Loan Repayment

In anticipation of the repayment of federal Canada Emergency Business Account 'CEBA' loan, the United Church has developed a repayment program for UCC congregations who find themselves struggling to fully repay their commercial CEBA loans - which would trigger foregoing the already accounted for forgiveness portion. We have created a loan program to support our congregations through this transition. To take advantage you must respond prior to December 10, 2023. To provide bridging support, the national office is prepared to facilitate a swap out of the commercial loan and replace it with a UCC loan. In short, UCC would issue loans of \$30,000 or \$40,000 for the express purpose of paying off CEBA. All eligible United Church CEBA loan holders in good standing with UCC are able to take advantage of this loan at an interest rate of 5.0%. First payment comes due February 1st, 2024. To get started simply complete the loan agreement and forward to Maria Pimpinella at mpimpinella@united-church.ca along with a copy of void cheque.

Ministry of Supervision

The Certificate in Ministry of Supervision provides participants with the information and skills to mentor individuals preparing for ministry by equipping them for supervision including pastoral practices, leadership, reflection, feedback and spiritual guidance.

It is designed for clergy and lay individuals who are interested in supporting students and communities for supervised ministry education (SME), internships and field education.

PREREQUISITES: A minimum of five years of post-ordination or commissioning, experience in congregational ministry leadership OR equivalent lay leadership

Online Information Session for Treasurers

On Monday December 11 at 7:00 p.m., Craig McAlpine and Brian Ruse will conduct a Zoom information session for Regional Council treasurers and other interested persons. The purpose of the session is to explain the new Regional Council resources available for treasurers (see next page for more information):

- the accounting software "Accounts" and "Donation" available from the company "Software4Nonprofits"
- the bookkeeping and accounting services available from the Quebec Council of Christian Charities/Conseil Québécois des Organismes Chrétiens to assist the treasurers of our communities of faith
- the auto-generating scheduling calendar/spreadsheet for treasurers, which creates a customized to-do list for treasurer tasks

REMINDER - New Resources for Treasurers

Nakonha:ka Regional Council has taken three initiatives to assist treasurers of our communities of faith in performing their duties.

Firstly, we have evaluated and are recommending the use of two easy-to-use and inexpensive non-profit accounting software products from the company Software4Nonprofits. Their bookkeeping software is called "Accounts" and has the following capabilities:

- bookkeeping (journal entries, sample or custom chart of accounts)
- banking (deposits, cheques, reconciliation)
- tracking income, expenses, assets, liabilities, funds
- generating financial statements (income statement, balance sheet)
- generating annual charity information returns (federal and provincial)

The annual cost of this software is \$129 plus tax. We have arranged for a \$50 discount on the first-year purchase price (i.e., you will pay \$79 for the first year) - please contact Brian Ruse prior to purchasing for information on obtaining the discount.

The second software product is called "Donation" and allows you to track donors and to create automated charitable tax receipts. A plus is that donations can be imported directly from PAR. The annual cost of this software is \$99 plus tax. We have also arranged for a \$50 discount on the first-year purchase price of this software (i.e., you will pay \$49 for the first year) - please contact Brian Ruse prior to purchasing for information on obtaining the discount.

Secondly, we have arranged with the Quebec Council of Christian Charities/Conseil Québécois des Organismes Chrétiens to assist the treasurers of our communities of faith. You will be able to take advantage, at no cost to you, of their bookkeeping and accounting services (in both French and English), including:

- · calculating payroll deductions
- preparing tax slips (T4, T4A, Relevé 1, etc.)
- · applying for GST & QST rebates
- preparing annual charity information returns (T3010, TP985.22-V)

Thirdly, the Property and Finance Leadership Team, thanks in large part to the efforts of member Craig McAlpine, has developed an auto-generating scheduling calendar/spreadsheet for treasurers, which creates a customized to-do list for treasurer tasks throughout the year.

We will be providing more information on these initiatives in the coming weeks. In the meantime, please contact Brian Ruse at bruse@united-church.ca with any questions.


Yummy local food and beverage, zero waste/handmade items, whimsical gifts, pottery, jewelry & clothing - you name it - with a focus on sustainability.
